

One of the largest automatically controlled buildings

The appealing hall in Poland serves as a storage hall and distribution centre for footwear. With its 23,000 m², it is one of the largest automatically controlled distribution centres in Eastern Europe. It was completed in March 2012, after a short construction phase.

Due to the fact that this is an area with mine-induced seismicity, the building was constructed so that it has nine connected parts with expansion joints. The distribution centre is 23 metres high and is equipped with a technically highly effective, automated small parts storage system that dispatches up to five million shoes every day. In order to ensure a smooth operation, the hall uses natural light. On the south facade of the building, the largest photovoltaic plant in Poland has been installed.
